

Register with Selective Service

Your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was not processed due to lack of Selective Service information. Most male students must register with Selective Service to receive federal aid. Please log back into your FAFSA and select "Register Me" for item 22. This is the most efficient way to allow your FAFSA to proceed with processing. If you have not reached your 18th birthday, FAFSA will automatically forward your name to the Selective Service to be registered at that time.

The registration of young men in the Selective Service System preserves America's ability to provide manpower in an emergency to the U.S. Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard). Almost all men ages 18 through 25 must register.

(For this selection, you must show date of entry stamp on passport, I-94 with date of entry stamp on it, or a letter from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services indicating the date that you entered the United States. If you entered the U.S. illegally after your 26 th birthday, you must provide proof that you were not living in the U.S. from age 18 through 25. A Resident Alien Card- Green Card – is not valid as proof of the date of entry to the U.S.)	
	I am a non-U.S. male on a valid non-immigrant visa. (For example, if you entered the United States with an F-1 student visa and remained in that status until your 26 th birth you would need to provide documentation indicating that you were admitted on an F-1 visa and attended school full-tire as required. Acceptable documentation for this situation include a copy of your I-20 form or a letter from the school yo attended indicating your full-time attendance as a non-immigrant alien. The same thing applies for all non-immigrant statuses.)	me
